UNITED WAY OF GREATER KNOXVILLE

unites people and resources to strengthen communities and solve systemic issues.

OUR IMPACT

FOOD SYSTEMS

We convened 3,000 people and organizations to learn, network, and collaborate to solve complex issues in our communities.

- 509 organizations mapped and 150+ individuals engaged in our food systems work
- 4k locally-grown tomato plants were distributed through our Great Tomato Project
- \$2 million was leveraged to enhance food security in our communities

EARLY CARE & EDUCATION SYSTEMS

- 850+ community members and 40+ organizations engaged and convened around early care and education
- 700 hours were spent in a community-wide strategic planning process create the Bright Steps Action Plan - a comprehensive approach to supporting children's well-being and development from birth to age 8
- \$4.5 million grant was secured for 3k students to receive high-dose, low-ratio tutoring

HOUSING SYSTEMS

- 189 clients attended our Launch Point Class that teaches life and job skills for people experiencing homelessness
- 75 stipends were provided for youth to attend the Homeless Youth Council Meetings
- \$390k in rent-value housing assistance was given through our House Knox program, serving 68 households

ECONOMIC MOBILITY SYSTEMS

- \$25 million state grant was received to develop the East Tennessee Collaborative
- With community partners, we're working with families to reduce poverty, increase economic opportunity pathways, and enhance social supports using a relational, comprehensive, and evidence-based approach

GRANTMAKING

We distributed \$7.8 million in grants to local nonprofits. 268,252 total community members were served by our nonprofit grantee partners (a 54% increase over the prior year!)

119,171 individuals participated in healthful activities

5,820 participants accessing affordable mental health services

36,149 families and caregivers with better access to childcare resources

6,511 individuals provided with basic needs assistance

Total touchpoints: 494,866 - 65% of the Greater Knoxville area population

A literal vehicle for change, the Changemobile was present at 68 events as a command center and a volunteer and event hub.




HACKATHONS
